*Independent Research* - I received a Monroe Scholar grant from the College to conduct research on racism institutionalized in military policy during World War II in Summer 2007. I will be conducting a second Monroe Scholar Project in Summer 2009 about the social utility of international courts and ad hoc tribunals in post-conflict areas. I am currently researching for the Project on International Peace and Security (PIPS), specifically the potential role of algae in energy security and development.
